Dear Parents and Caregivers Kia Ora

We would like to provide an opportunity for children to share with parents their work in their classrooms. Parents are welcome to view displays and their children's work until 10.00am.

I would like to ask parents to respect the privacy of other students by not taking photos in the classroom. We would also appreciate teachers having the freedom to work with all students during the time the room is open. I hope you are able to take the opportunity to attend.

NEW ROOMS

This Monday we were finally given the green light to occupy the two new rooms on the field. These rooms have been supplied by the Ministry of Education (MOE) due to our growing roll numbers. The rooms are now:

Room 13 New Entrant class

Room 27 Year 4 (from Room 13) Miss Whooley Room 28 Year 4 (from Room 26) Mrs Paterson

Room 26 will be used for groups of students when required.

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The new rooms are being leased by the MOE and are not considered permanent. The Board views the new rooms as a temporary solution to our schools current growth. The Board is awaiting MOE confirmation that we have received 'seeding' funding to review our whole school site/buildings for the best solution for future development. Browns Bay School has been identified in a demographic report as needing more classrooms before 2020.

The Contractors have a contractual obligation to restore the field and have arranged for Field Turf NZ to come and advise them on the repairs. Field Turf NZ has been responsible for grounds like Eden Park and many other international grounds.

ROAD SAFETY

I feel as though I am becoming a broken record on this matter, but yesterday after school while on Drop Off duty, Tim (our parent helper) and I saw a small child in our uniform run across the road (by the Hall entrance) to get into a

car. The child was so small they would not have been visible coming out from the parked cars to any driver, until the last second and they were just very lucky to not be run over.

PLEASE tell your children to cross at the marked pedestrian crossings and also PLEASE model this behaviour as adults.
