BLAST IN THE BAYS

We are very excited to announce that next year around Guy Fawkes, Friends of The School will be creating the biggest public fireworks event on the North Shore called **'Blast In The Bays'**. With the support of our school Board of Trustees and the Browns Bay Business Association, development for this large scale event is already underway with a professional events company. **Blast In The Bays** will be a fundraiser to help support our school and will provide an evening of entertainment culminating in a dazzling, professional pyrotechnics display. COMMUNITY OF LEARNING

This year Browns Bay School worked with the six other local Primary, Intermediate and College schools as part of the MidBays Community of Learning / Kahui Ako. We focused on the teaching of Mathematics and utilised the resources of the Mid-Bay Kahui Ako to support this professional development. Our In-school Leaders (ISL) worked alongside Marie Hirst from Cognition, to promote innovative teaching practices in Mathematics. The ISL Team used information from a survey of our students regarding Mathematics and what helps them learn, as a basis for introducing the use of Talk Moves in the classroom.

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Community Notices

In the survey our students reflected that what would most help them learn would be: mathletics, quiet spaces to work in and buddy problem solving. The ISL team believed the use of Talk Moves would help develop buddy problem solving in class, and also support the students and teachers with a framework for developing learning conversations. The Talk Move idea is promoted in the Accelerated Learning in Mathematics (ALIM) programme supported by the Ministry of Education.

Talk Moves asks teachers to use certain questions / phrases to stimulate the development of mathematical thinking, across the whole class or group. The Talk Move phrases the ISL Team asked teachers to use are shown in the poster alongside.

In the classroom, teachers used mixed ability problem solving sessions as a platform for the students to have learning conversations supported by the Talk Move phrases.

The ISL Team further contributed to our school learning by responding to teachers' requests for child-speak versions of the phrases. These versions were pictorial and shared across all levels to provide consistency of practice.

eLEARNING PARENT MEETING

Browns Bay School endeavours to provide a modern learning environment for its students. A significant feature of a modern learning environment is having a strong e-learning programme. Our e-learning goal is that "students will become engaged and self-directed in a learning

environment which effectively integrates ICT across the curriculum. We want our children to be connected to their learning, connected to their future, connected to their personal excellence and connected to their community".

The Board has allocated significant funding to provide the programme for the students over the years. This has been highlighted by the continued upgrades to devices as well as maintaining the wireless network and migrating to cloud based servers. The use of Google Apps for Education has allowed a streamlined and managed system for our students to access a suite of publication apps.

We will be inviting parents to a presentation on Tuesday 28th November at 7pm, via a notice home. At the meeting we will show eLearning practices from the classrooms. The meeting will cover e-Learning in the Curriculum, Google Applications for Education (GAFE) and Bring Your Own Devices (BYOD) from Year 4.

WE-LEARN CONFERENCE

On Monday 13th November a few Y5/6 students were chosen to attend the first ever student WeLearn conference at Torbay School. It was a half day conference for students focusing on learning with digital technologies with the students holding workshops for other students to attend.

There were 11 schools involved, 100 students and 20 teachers, all learning from each other. All of our students were able to attend workshops and have a taste of coding to robotics, using Makey Makey's to Google Draw, virtual reality to exploring creative apps. Our three Year 6 students did a fantastic job of running a workshop on how to use Stop Go Animation in the classroom, and how they use this as a tool for learning and presenting in their classroom at BBS. It was a really successful morning and we hope that we will be able to be involved in another day like this again in 2018.
