SCHOOL FOCUS

One of our focus areas for 2020 is the whole school implementation of the Kia Kaha Programme. This is an Antibullying programme supported by the NZ Police. Teachers will be implementing this programme throughout the year, with support from our Police Education Officer. The Programme is designed to help young people learn and apply a range of safe practices that they can use to build and maintain successful relationships throughout their lives.

Reading will be a major school focus for 2020. On Thursday 30 January teaching staff attended a one day conference on "The Reading Book" by Sheena Cameron and Louise Dempsey. The course focused on:

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An overview of a balanced reading programme

- Unpacking the reading process
- Creating opportunities for oral language in the reading programme

Shared reading

• Using the shared reading approach at all levels of the school to explicitly teach comprehension, critical thinking and decoding

Guided reading

- Planning and organising guided reading lessons
- Reviewing a range of generic activities that engage students, reduce teacher planning and offer an alternative to worksheets

Independent reading

• Reviewing the importance of independent reading, including ideas to motivate and engage students in the reading process

Teachers came away excited and inspired by new ideas to work on with students during their Literacy programmes.

CORONAVIRUS UPDATE

Browns Bay School's response continues to be guided by the Ministry of Education and Ministry of Health. We still require all students (domestic and international) who have travelled from, or via, mainland China to undertake a period of 14-day self-isolation in order to ensure that our community remains at low risk from the spread of the virus. All other students are to be in school as usual and absences will be recorded in the usual manner.

Our approach is in excess of the minimum requirements and we will continue to take a precautionary attitude. In the meantime, we hope that all of our community will continue to extend kindness and compassion to those affected by the impacts of the threat of coronavirus.

SUNHATS

Sunhats are compulsory for all children for Term 1 2020. I would also recommend that sunscreen be put on your child each day. Students may also wear sunglasses.

VISION AND HEARING TESTING

The Vision and Hearing Technicians will be visiting our school as part of the Vision and Hearing Screening Programme

They will be in contact closer to the scheduled day to let us know which students will be tested, and require a consent form signed by a parent or guardian.

Children eligible to be tested include:

- 1. New Entrants to the school who have not had a B4 School Hearing and Vision test at Pre-school.
- 2. Children who need rescreening or were absent from previous testing.
- 3. Children new to the school who have not been tested in New Zealand.

Children do not need to be tested if they have completed the B4 School Check

SPORTS
