ECO WARRIORS

We are the **Eco Warriors** and we try to help the environment be rubbish free. You may see us around school, doing the composting and picking up rubbish. Please help us by making sure you have lunches that have the least amount of rubbish you can!

Ways you could help the environment:

- Pick up rubbish-even if it's not yours.
- Have Litterless Lunches: no plastic or rubbish inside it.
- Save single use plastic to make models or toys.
- Give used clothes, toys or other things to charity
- Use Beeswax Wrap instead of plastic wrap
- Make signs and posters demanding change to the environment
- Use reusable containers
- Make things out of your plastic (Plastic bottles into little plant holders or bird feeders, for example).
- Pick up at least 1 piece of rubbish a day (1+ a day).
- Put compost in the compost bin (banana peels, apple cores etc.)

On Friday, 30th August we collected the schools rubbish for 1 day and it weighed 23.1 kg! The Eco Warriors are NOT happy about how much rubbish is going to the landfill.





So remember to pick up 1 piece of rubbish every day and because there are so many of us, we will pick up about 600 pieces a day!

SCHOOL NOTICES

NEW ZEALAND SHAKE OUT

New Zealand Shake Out, our national earthquake drill is taking place on Thursday 17 October 2018 at 1:30pm. The school will be taking part in the New Zealand Shake Out. At that time we will ask everyone to Drop, Cover and Hold for up to one minute. Some areas will practise a tsunami hīkoi yet we will not do that this time.



The children will:

Do the Drop, Cover, and Hold drill for 30-60 seconds:

- DROP down on your hands and knees. This protects you from falling but lets you move if you need to.
- COVER your head and neck (or your entire body if possible) under a sturdy table or desk (if it is within a few steps of you).
- HOLD on to your shelter (or your position to protect your head and neck) until the shaking stops. If the shaking shifts your shelter around, move with it.

Other ideas are:

If you are unable to drop, brace yourself in a chair or wheelchair (lock your wheels) and cover your head and neck with your hands and arms. If you are unable to get out of bed, cover your head and neck with a pillow.

Many people are injured while trying to move DURING the shaking. It is safer to Drop, Cover, and Hold until the shaking is over.

MEASLES

Auckland is experiencing an unprecedented measles outbreak. Schools have had to exclude students and staff with measles and any close contacts who haven't been fully immunised with the measles-mumps-rubella (MMR) vaccine. This has disrupted the school, the students' learning and parents who have had to take time off work. Measles can have serious complications requiring hospitalisation.

With exam and assessment time coming up in secondary schools, we suggest parents check their children have had two doses of the MMR vaccine. This will also protect students from the contagious mumps and rubella viruses as well.
