Dear Parents and Caregivers Kia Ora

COVOID19 - CORONAVIRUS

During the weekend and this week there has been much media coverage on this topic.

Browns Bay School has been receiving excellent updates from the Ministry of Education and Ministry of Health on this issue for the past few weeks. We follow the daily updates and inform you if necessary.

The current advice, as of March 3:

- The travel restriction for people from China and Iran have been extended.
- People arriving from Northern Italy and from South Korea must self-isolate for 14 days.

While a parent of secondary school students on the North Shore has been confirmed as the second COVID-19 case in Auckland, please be assured there has been no exposure from this case at these schools or any other schools. The facts are:

- \circ $\;$ The students did not travel with their parents.
- The students have been to school since their parents returned, but they were not infectious. They did not have, and do not have, any symptoms.
- All of the family is in isolation, but the students are well and are at home as a precaution.

Please continue to refer to the Ministry of Health website for further information. We have also put a Fact sheet on our Website for parents.

Handwashing to prevent spread

All schools and early learning services are still in the **Keep it Out** phase of a pandemic plan. The preventative measures The Ministry of Health is encouraging schools to practice are those of good hygiene, which include:

- Washing hands with soap and water before and after eating as well as after attending the toilet
- Covering coughs and sneezes with clean tissues or with an elbow
- Putting used tissues in the bin
- Encouraging staff and students to stay home if they are unwell

You will be aware that advice from the Ministry of Health asks everyone to wash your hands often and thoroughly with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, making sure you dry them thoroughly. Singing Happy Birthday twice, slowly should take about 20 seconds.

关于新型冠状病毒疫情最新通知

自上周末起媒体出现大量关于新西兰新型管状病毒疫情的报道。

Browns Bay小学在过去几周内就疫情问题一直与教育部和卫生部保持密切联系。我们将继续每天关注情况变化,并在必要时及时通知。

3月3日的建议与通知如下:

针对中国、伊朗游客的**旅游禁令已**经延长。

从意大利北部,韩国出发前往新西兰的人员·入境后需要自我隔离14天,并向卫生健康专线登记。 尽管奥克兰北岸一所高中的学生家长被确诊为第二例新冠肺炎患者,该校及其他学校并未受到影响 :

确诊病人子女并未与其同行。

两名学生虽然在其父母返回新西兰后到过学校,但他们并未被感染,没有任何症状。

所有家庭成员都处于隔离状态中。两名学生目前健康状况良好并留在家中以防止出现感染和继续传播。

请继续留意卫生部网站相关资讯。校方会继续将相关通知放在学校网站。

勤洗手以避免病毒传播

目前所有学校和早教机构都采取防控疫情流行的措施。卫生部鼓励学校采取的预防措施是保持良好 的卫生习惯,其中包括:

进食前后用肥皂和水洗手。

咳嗽或打喷嚏时,用干净**的**纸巾或者肘部掩盖口鼻。

将用过的纸巾丢弃至垃圾桶。

鼓励员工和学生在身体不适时留在家中。

卫生部要求每次洗手时,需使用肥皂和水彻底洗手至少20秒,并确保彻底擦干双手。请告诉孩子20 秒大约相当于唱两遍生日歌的时间。

코보이드19 – 코로나바이러스

주말과 이번 주 동안 이 주제에 대한 많은 언론 보도가 있었습니다.

브라운스베이 스쿨은 지난 몇 주 동안 이 문제에 대해 교육부와 보건부로부터 업데이트를 받고 있습니다. 저희는 매일 업데이트 내용을 따르고 필요하다면 학부모님들에게 알려드릴 것 입니다.

3월 3일 현재 사항

중국과 이란에서 온 여행자들에 대한 기존의 여행 제한이 연장되었습니다. 북이탈리아와 한국으로부터 온 여행자들은 14일 동안 자가 격리를 해야합니다.

노스 쇼어에있는 고등학교에 다니는 학생들의 부모가 오클랜드에서 두 번째 COVID-19 사례로 확인되었지만 이 학교나 다른 학교에서는 이 사례에 노출되지 않았음이 확인됩니다. 사실은 다음과 같습니다

o 이 학생들은 그들의 부모와 함께 여행하지 않았습니다.

o 학생들은 부모가 돌아온 후 학교에 다녔지만 전염되지 않았습니다. 그들은 증상이 없었으며 현재도 증상이 없습니다.

o 모든 가족이 격리되어 있지만 학생들은 건강하고, 예방 조치로 집에 있습니다.

전염을 막기 위한 손 씻기

모든 학교와 취학전 교육기관에서는 전염이 되지 않기위해 노력하고 있고 다음의 예방책을 지켜주기를 당부하고 있습니다.

• 식사 전후, 화장실 다녀간 후 비누 및 물로 손 씻기

• 깨끗한 부분 또는 팔꿈치로 기침과 재채기를 감싸는 것

• 사용한 휴지는 쓰레기통에 넣는 것

• 학교 직원과 학생이 건강이 좋지 않을 경우 집에 머물도록 권장

비누와 물로 최소한 20초 동안 손을 자주 그리고 철저하게 씻도록 권장합니다. 생일축하 노래를 두 번 부르면 천천히 20초 정도 걸릴 것이라고 하니 참고해주세요.

CONFERENCES

Teachers are available to meet with parents during the year to have discussions about student's progress and concerns. Please be aware that two afternoons each week are reserved for Staff and Team meetings. BUILDING WORK

Next week there is planned building work starting outside Room 17 and Rooms 24 – 25 to replace ramps, stairs and decks. The builders will be on site until early next term. By the end of the work period we will have a new deck outside Rooms 14 to 17 and new stairs outside Room 24 and 25. In other locations there will be new handrails installed. The work will require safety fencing to be installed on Monday in the:

- Bottom carpark
- Court area outside Room 17
- Stairs outside Room 24 and 25

We would request parents do not use the bottom carpark as a gateway to the school next week (as we will have drilling equipment there as well).

Due to this construction work we will be moving one class to a spare room in the school because of potential noise distraction.

KINDO PAYMENTS – SCHOOL DONATION

Also a reminder that the discount for full payment of the school donation ceases from the end of Term 1. Those who have chosen to make the payment on a term by term basis are most welcome to continue to do so, with the next payment due at the beginning of Term 2.

Voluntary school donations may be able to get a rebate of up to one third of the donation if you :

- have earned taxable income
- lived in New Zealand at any time over the tax year
- are an individual (not a company or partnership for tax purposes), and
- have paid voluntary donations to a state or state-integrated school
