Dear Parents and Caregivers Kia Ora

Term 1 ends on Friday 16 April and Term 2 begins on Monday 03 May. Our School Inquiry topic is **Connections – Make Connections – Seek to Understand.** The Social Science learning objectives focus on understanding how the past is important and how time and change affect people's lives.



SCHOOL ASSEMBLIES

Each year group will look at this concept in a different way. The Year 1 students will be visiting the Howick Pioneer Village to see how the children in the early 1900's were taught at school.

These studies will support one of our key school values: Inquiring Minds/Whai Whaakaro. Our school value is represented in this poster by the blue background and is described as the 'wide world of knowledge'. This value is about exploring, wondering and questioning the world of knowledge. We encourage students to develop their thinking skills so they can aim to be innovative, creative and critical thinkers.

# From Term 2 we will be adjusting our School Assemblies to a mid-term and end of term arrangement. The School Assemblies will continue to be on a Friday and split with a Year 1 to 3 Assembly at 9.45am and a Year 4 to 6 Assembly at 11.45am. The Assemblies will be organised by a Year Group and parents are invited to attend any of these Assemblies.

School certificates and awards will be presented at both Assemblies and the parents of these children will receive a special invitation. At the End of Term Assembly, each class teacher will award two certificates to two deserving students.

#### How to claim back your donation rebate.

You can claim back 33.33c for every dollar you spend on donations (where donations are greater than \$5). Here's how to find your school donation receipts for this years' tax rebate claim:

kindo. making school payments simple

- 1. Log in to myKindo.co.nz and go to *My Orders*.
- 2. Choose record type 'Donation Receipts'.
- 3. Set the *date range*
- 4. Select Download Summary for IRD tax return to get a PDF document suitable for attaching to your tax return

(containing all school donation amounts paid in the year). Individual donation receipts can also be

downloaded as required, or several can be selected and downloaded into a zip file.
