Dear Parents and Caregivers

I would like to welcome our New Entrants and their families who have started in Room 1 with Kylie Van Der Westhuizen. Some of these students have had a delayed start to school due to Level 3 restrictions, so we are pleased to finally see them at school.

JUNIOR VALUES AWARD

At the Year 3 Assembly I was delighted to present the inaugural SKIDS Junior Values Award to Indy Hendricks from Room 15.

We are very grateful to Sue and the SKIDS team for supporting the school through the donation of this trophy.

Year 1 to 3 students will be eligible for this Award.

PROPERTY

The junior classes in Rooms 1 to 12 will soon be enjoying the new air conditioning units that are being installed into the classrooms. The units have been funded by the Board from the 2019 School Investment Package. The units will definitely help on the hot summer days!

COVID-19

The COVID-19 website states that Alert Level 2 will remain in place until at least Sunday 6 September 2020. As this timing is quite late for the start of the new week, we will continue with our current processes next week, especially the existing Drop-Off and Pick-Up arrangements.

The notice about the Countdown Supermarket earlier this week again reminds us about the need for keeping a record of where we have been. The School has not received any alerts from the Ministry of Health regarding the supermarket.

Some COVID-19 reminders are:

- At home, please continue with good hand hygiene, cough and sneeze etiquette, appropriate physical distancing when out and about and keeping your child home if they are sick.
- The official advice on face coverings is that children and young people do not need to wear face coverings at school. Other public health control measures are in place including children and staff staying home if they are sick, contact tracing, and hygiene requirements. Regardless, if your child does want to wear a face mask, that is fine.

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Community Notices

• We are continuing with contact tracing by having the Governments QR code posters at our entrances, so please check in every time you come onsite. We keep a visitor register in the Office for anyone who comes onsite for a period of time. The Room 1 and 2 teachers manage their own Drop-Off and Pick-Up registers. The Year 1 and 2 teachers manage their own Pick-Up registers.

The staff are following the guidelines expected of a school with regards to student hygiene practices:

- Wash and dry hands, cough into elbow, do not touch your face, stay home if you are sick, report flu-like symptoms.
- Disinfect and clean all surfaces daily.
- Hand sanitiser at entry to classrooms and in shared spaces. Soap, water and the ability to dry hands must be provided in bathrooms.

Classroom supplies for staff and students` health and safety are:

- \circ $\;$ Boxes of facial tissues, for disposal of in the rubbish bin.
- \circ $\;$ Hand sanitiser pump pack in close proximity to the entrance door for use.
- o Liquid soap adjacent to the sink area for hand washing.
- Paper towels in a dispenser for drying hands.

DISTANCE LEARNING

Supporting student learning when they are at home

At Alert Level 2 we will support learning at home for those <u>required to self-isolate on health advice</u>, waiting for a test result or choosing to remain at home because they are vulnerable to illness.

The Distance Learning Grids are still available and a new grid is on the school website for these children. Teachers are now focused on the children <u>at school</u> and supporting their progress and achievement; they are available to support vulnerable children.

Children who are staying at home because parents are concerned about COVID yet are not vulnerable may stay at home, yet please note this is not considered a justified absence. These children can still access the Distance Learning Grids yet we would prefer them to return to school.

To our Auckland whānau

This letter is to inform you about the service delivery for the Children's Community Dental Service (Auckland Regional Dental Service).

During Level 3, there were national restrictions on the health services able to be offered to minimise the risk of spreading COVID-19. This included restrictions on routine dental treatments and check-ups. Because of this, we have now commenced our COVID-19 Recovery Plan. This means we need to firstly offer appointments to children who have been identified as requiring treatment and those waiting the longest for their routine examination. We also offer an acute service for any child who is experiencing dental pain. In addition, during the transition to Level 2 there may be some restrictions in the range of dental treatments that we are able to provide.

We apologise in advance for the delays this will cause for some children who are due a routine check-up. Please be assured that we will contact you as soon as we are able to offer your child an appointment with our service.

In the meantime, if your child is in pain or you have immediate concerns with their teeth, please phone 0800 TALK TEETH (0800-8255-83384). Our staff will be available to discuss your concerns with you directly, and will offer your child an appointment if required.
