TE AO MAORI DAY

On Friday 2nd August the third Te Ao Maori Day was held at the school. This day was a collaboration between the school and the Maori Whanau community to support Maori students in their cultural knowledge. The students involved presented their pepeha to whanau, completed projects based on Tikanga Maori, and prepared a hangi meal that whanau enjoyed later that day.

As part of the day our Kaumatua, John Retimana, blessed the new garden area by the entrance of the school (near Room 8). In the garden area we planted harakeke (flax) and kowhai. BOT member, Ben Sheeran, organised the harakeke, and with help from the students from the Te Ao Maori group and Year 3, the beginning of the garden was planted. We also had special visitors from the East Coast Bays Community Creche help plant some harakeke too (see our Banner photo). The goal is to develop this area in native bush to attract bird life to our school and to also create our own sustainable area of harakeke for weaving.





GARDENING CLUB

The School Gardening Club has once again proved to be popular this term with a new group of students joining the Monday session to learn about all aspects of growing plants.

Our 3 beds are full of all sorts with so many greens the kids got to take some home the first week back. Currently we have silverbeet, spinach, carrots, leeks, beetroot, rocket, broad beans a tonne of parsley, and lots more growing. The kids are learning to identify these and understand what we can use them for. Most of the kids have helped plant these from seeds. We often have plants flowering and going to seed, which give us an opportunity to see the bees at work and our plants re-sow themselves. So many opportunities for the kids to learn!

We have been very fortunate that Sarah Sheeran has organised with the local council for some new gloves for our young gardeners. We also have some new spades which will be getting some use in the spring.

SCHOOL NOTICES

MEASLES

The Auckland Regional Public Health have sent out an email update to schools about measles. They have been sending out regular updates and the last one advises Principals to:

- Update immunisation registers
- Encourage staff and families to get immunised

The best way to prevent getting measles is to have the MMR (Measles, Mumps and Rubella) vaccination. They recommend that you get vaccinated with at least one MMR if you do not have proof of vaccination or of having had measles. This is free for those under 50 (for adults there may be a small admin fee). Adults over the age of 50 are considered immune.

If we are alerted by the Regional Health (and it is only them that can alert us) that we have had a measles case, any child or adult under the age of 50 who has been in the same classroom, or confined space, with the case will be asked to stay at home if they:

- Have not had at least one documented MMR at least two weeks prior
- Or have not had a blood test or doctor's record showing they are immune to measles

Adults over the age of 50 are considered immune, as they are likely to have been exposed to measles as a child. The reason for this update is that more than 20 schools in Auckland have had one or more cases of measles.
