BBS Swimming Sports 2018

On Thursday the 1st of March BBS will be holding a swim trial meet to select our top year 4-6 swimmers who will represent Browns Bay School at the 2018 Cluster Schools Swim Meet. The trials will be held at Owen Glen Pool off Apollo Drive. Y4-6 classes will put forward names of children who are competent swimmers and show potential. In order to be considered for the trial children must be able to swim at least 25m, at speed, in deep water. Trials will consist of 4 strokes, but children only need to be competent in one. If your child is keen to do this, please let the class teacher know. Children who are identified for the trial will get a notice closer to the time. To be able to run this mini meet we will require interested parents that are able to help and assist during the morning. From this trial the top swimmers from each year level will be selected to represent Browns Bay School at our Cluster Schools Swim meet, held in week 10, Friday 6th April at Northern Arena, Silverdale.

DROP OFF ZONE

The Drop Off zone on Masterton Road has some particular procedures we would like you to know. They are:

STUDENT SAFETY - BEFORE SCHOOL

The school has the following arrangements for student supervision before school:

- Students may be on site before 8.30am for coaching or practice as long as a parent is present in the coaching role or manager
- Students may be on site under parent supervision
- 8.30 am Teachers are in classrooms with students having access to storage and toilets
- Two teachers/adults are on duty at the crossings from 8.30 am to 8.50am
- Teacher on duty at car drop off / pick up zone (this is usually DP or Principal) from 8.40am
- Junior teachers are not on duty in the morning so they can be in their room to ensure there is a transition from parents before school

SKiDs operate a Before School programme for children who need to be dropped off early.

CURIOUS ABOUT FOTS?

- 1. What is FOTS? Formerly known as the PTA, we are registered charity made up of parents/caregivers who volunteer their time to raise funds for BBS and help connect our School community through events. Our biggest fundraising focus right now is to upgrade the Junior Playground and we've made some great progress!
- 2. **How is FOTS managed?** We have an Executive Committee that leads the group which is voted in at our AGM each March for a 1 year term.
- 3. **How often does FOTS meet?** Once a month, currently Wednesday nights at 7.15pm in the staff room.
- 4. **Who goes to meetings?** Parents/caregivers of BBS children and members of BBS' Senior Leadership Team. It's a great way to learn more about the School and meet other parents/caregivers.
- 5. What happens at the meetings? The meetings are chaired by the FOTS President who follows an Agenda of items. There's always an interesting report from the Principal Peter Mulcahy and we discuss our fundraising progress and event planning for the term. There's usually some form of chocolate or wine on hand!
- 6. If I come to a FOTS meeting, will I be expected to start organising something right away? No one expects you to sign up to something on the spot unless you really want to of course!
- 7. **Can I join FOTS without attending meetings?** Yes. Volunteering on FOTS activities can be completed by email and phone.
- 8. **How much of my time will FOTS take?** Whatever is realistic for you! Every little bit of help makes a difference. You might help coordinate one event or choose to do more. Most of our volunteering can fit around commitments to work and family.
- Will I have to work with a large committee? No. FOTS activities are managed by smaller sub-committees of 2-5 people. This keeps things







manageable, the tasks are shared as a team and you get the opportunity to volunteer alongside others. Some great friendships have formed from FOTS volunteers working together.



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
