All teaching staff will be attending a professional development day with the teachers from our Community of Learning Cluster. This is the day before the Queen's Birthday weekend and may be an opportunity to make it a slightly longer weekend.

BUILDING WORKS

In a couple of weeks there will be repair work being completed in the following areas:

- Rooms 1-7: Corridor skylights replaced to stop leaks
- Room 7 exterior wall: rotten boards replaced •
- ESOL Room: roof replaced
- Rooms 8 11: Browns Bay Road side roof edges replaced

The builders are expected to be on site for 6 weeks. The areas will be fenced off for the safety of everyone and may mean the redirection of walking traffic around these rooms. The ESOL roof repair means we lose 5 parks in the top carpark over a week and will need to move the disabled parking space temporarily.

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BULLY FREE WEEK

This week Browns Bay School has taken part in the New Zealand wide Bully Free Week promotion. Classes have been completing activities looking at what is being a bully and what you can do to get help. The theme this year is 'Let's talk about it' and the week provided a great opportunity for our students to talk about what bullying means to them.

• If your child is being bullied at school – please report it to a teacher.

<u>What is bullying?</u> Bullying is any repeated, unprovoked and unwelcomed behaviour by student/s designed to hurt, threaten or frighten other student/s in such a way that the student feels unable to prevent such behaviour.




Help our Streams Strive to Survive

Room 25 have been doing a Stream study at Rothesay Bay Stream. The aim is to help save our streams and the freshwater life.

We went with Sophie from the Whitebait Connection Programme, on two trips down to the stream. On the first trip we looked to see how clear the stream was and did some water testing and identified bugs within our stream.

During water testing we used a water clarity tube to see how clear the water was. It was between 59% - 100% on this day, which is good. We also tested the pH level to see what the acidic or alkaline level is and temperature, in case it is too high for the fish and the insects in our stream to survive.



colour was murky and too dangerous to do any testing. After our investigation we discussed ways in which you and I could help protect our local habitat and freshwater life?

- Throw your rubbish in the bins provided
- Dog owners please pick up your dog poo
- Report if the stream is smelling or looks bad to your local council
- Keeping our beach area tidy so rubbish doesn't go into the stream

We want to see our stream clean, clear and healthy for the inanga fish, insects and bugs that live there.

Keep our freshwater life alive today so that we can let them live another day.

TRAFFIC SAFETY


School traffic in the morning and afternoon is extremely busy around Browns Bay School and it is a time when students need to be shown Road Safety ideas. The best one of all is

Use the pedestrian crossings on Masterton Road and Browns Bay Road

We are aware parents are crossing the road with their children at other areas yet this does not show children the best ways. Adults can judge the speed of cars, can see further ahead and are more visible to drivers whereas children are smaller and don't make the best judgements at times. We cannot patrol all the roads so I am asking that you show children the safest way to cross roads and use the crossings.

MEASLES ALERT

As students return from the Term 1 holidays, the Ministry of Health is reminding schools to be aware of the risks of measles. Over the past month, measles cases have been reported in Canterbury, the Southern District Health Board region, Nelson-Marlborough, Hamilton and Auckland.



Immunisation is the best protection against measles and to be effective, people need

to have two measles, mumps and rubella (MMR) vaccinations. Anyone who is unsure if they are fully immunised against measles can be vaccinated for free at their GP. Anyone who is not immunised and gets exposed to a confirmed case of measles will need to stay home for at least 14 days to ensure the virus doesn't spread.

General advice

Anyone who suspects they may have measles should avoid contact with other people, especially those who aren't fully immunised, and should phone their GP before visiting. It is important to call first because measles is highly infectious, and people with measles can infect others in the waiting room.


Mathathon begins on Monday 28 May...Keep an eye out for all the information, questions etc as they will come home on that date.

Open Schools Program is a 6 week Snow Sports program for students who are interested in learning to ski or snowboard or looking to improve technique and ability. The program includes:


1 hour group lesson including:
