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REPORTING TO PARENTS

The purpose of these conferences is to have 'learning conversations' between students, parents and teachers. Students have a key role to play in these conferences so it would be appreciated if they could attend if at all possible. A student led conference is a time for you to come and listen to your child share their learning. The conference will last for 15 minutes and will be facilitated by the teacher, but led by the student.

The involvement of the students in the Conference is dependent on their age. Conferences will follow the general format of:

- Introductions
- Sharing of student work
- Discussion of achievements over the year

- Sharing the next steps of learning.
- Parent Question time

If you require longer I would suggest that you make a separate time at a later date, so as not to inconvenience parents waiting.


The reporting to parents on student achievement in relation to National Standards is no longer a part of our school

reports. The National Standards reporting has been replaced with reporting against the NZ Curriculum levels as outlined in the NZ Curriculum document 2007 (Pg 44).

The chart opposite shows how the curriculum levels typically relate to years at school. These curriculum levels are shown on our Progress Graphs (they have always been there).

The achievement objectives in each of the Levels are

broad statements yet there are specific tests in reading, writing and maths that allow a teacher to make a judgement of a student's curriculum level (e.g. Success at Reading Curriculum Level 3 is at 11-12 years based on a Probe reading test with a comprehension score of over 75%). These teacher judgements are shared with parents on the Progress graphs.



The school report format for Mid-Year has remained the same as previous years.

UNION MEETING

The Primary Teachers Union, the New Zealand Education Institute (NZEI), has advised the Board of Paid Union Meetings being organised for members. NZEI members are entitled to attend the Paid Union Meetings, where they will discuss the new Collective Agreement. The meetings for the North Shore members are during school time. In our school we have a majority of teachers who are Union members. The teachers who are members of NZEI are attending the PUM on Tuesday 19 June.

LOCKDOWN DRILL

Last week the school practiced a 'Lock down' drill or STAY drill. The practice was monitored by Harrison and Tew, a company that specialises in supporting schools with Emergency Management processes.

Their report to the Board contained the following points: "The school followed the procedures calmly and confidently, with clear direction and purpose from the senior leadership team. The students and staff should be praised for the way they followed the correct procedures and at the speed and skill at which the school was placed into lockdown. Harrison Tew have worked with Peter and Browns Bay School for several years now and on behalf of the company I can state categorically that Browns Bay School are very competent and well-prepared to manage any emergency that the school may face." After the drill staff also commented on the calm and focused way in which the children coped with the experience.

Each term we practice either a STAY or GO drill with the whole school and it is pleasing to get such feedback.
