BULLYING FREE NZ

We are a bullying free school because we have students that know is not right to bully others, they also know that it was bullying free week. They all should know the BBS values Respect, Inquiring Minds, Taking Responsibility and Personal Excellence.

If you need help you can ask for help, It is ok to tell it's not right to do it. We have duty teachers at lunch if you need help. If there's a in a classroom you can go to them and tell them. There are peer mediation if someone hurt your feelings you go to them or the wheel of choice do not go to them if your hurt physically, go to the duty teachers if your hurt physically.

Bully free NZ let's talk about it!

There was Ally, tears rushing down hers face crouching in her locker. The horrible memories raced through her mind like a rocket going into space, you should be ashamed of yourself twit, all those rude words. What is this from you ask? Bullying that's what! If you have been bullied before or have actually seen someone being bullied you'll know that it's not nice at all. So you can use these ways to help you or others in need. At Browns Bay School we promote bully free, so no bullying allowed. We as a school actually use these ways to help others.

It's ok to share

You don't have to be scared or ashamed when you have been bullied, people are there to help you. Like your teacher, you can talk to him or her about what is happening and they may give you advice on how to handle it. Maybe you have family or friends that you trust, that you can ask them to help you. Always remember that you should share how you feel don't be shy. Duty teachers or teachers who are outside at lunch can help you. Have you heard of STAR. First is S, S means stop. Is what you've seen right if it's not that brings us to the next letter. T stands for think what should you do. A, act do what you 'thought if it's sensible. Finally R, report to an adult who you can ask for help. One way that I really like is a boys and gris group talks with the teachers. So basically you talk to your teacher about what has been happening. At my school the teacher arranges a group of girls or boys at lunchtime and you chat to your classmates about how you feel. Peer Mediation is another way of solving bullying. Peer mediators can't help solve any physical abuse only verbal abuse. If someone suffers physical abuse then you should tell a duty teacher or a teacher who is outside at lunch or morning tea immediately.

So that's just a few ways Browns Bay School is a bully free school and how we stop bullying because t is not right in any way.

Let's Talk About It Bullying Free NZ

We students here at Browns Bay School are writing to promote bullying free New Zealand.

Browns Bay School is a bullying free school thanks to students knowing that bullying is not the right thing to do. Our school values remind us to not bully and to respect everyone around us. Respect and Taking Responsibility are the best ones in the case of bullying. Respect, which is pretty self explanatory, for example treat others how you would like to be treated. Taking responsibility is still as important as respect as you are encouraged to make sensible choices in school.

We use our own school solutions to help solve bullying problems.

Students use our **Wheel of Choice** to solve tension independently, which has a variety of solutions to solve problems. Another of our anti-bullying solutions is

S.T.A.R, which stands for Stop, Think, Act and Report. We use this if we think that the situation has escalated too far and that the victim of the bully needs to report to a teacher or a lunchtime supervisor, aka a duty teacher. Peer Mediators go out at lunchtime and are the ones to sort verbal bullying and redirect you to the duty teacher if physical harm. Duty Teachers help at lunchtime and cover all types of harm, physical, psychological or verbal.

In the end, any type of bullying is not ok, whether or not it is physical, psychological or verbal. Make sure that you do not bully and encourage others to stop bullying. Be the one to make a change and stop bullying.
