



PRINCIPALS MESSAGE

Dear Parents and Caregivers Kia Ora

The roads around the school have been very busy in the mornings and afternoons and we have witnessed some concerning 'traffic behaviour'. I would ask that everyone be mindful of the message they are sending to the children, particularly in regard to crossing the road. We have two Pedestrian crossings in operation in the morning and afternoon and we ask that you please use them with your children. Crossing on the corner of Browns Bay Road and Masterton Road in between the traffic is **not** a safe message to pass onto the children.

The drop off/pick up zone is not a place that cars can wait at – please move on if your child is not ready for you – as queues of cars waiting to get into the pick-up area cause a huge amount of traffic congestion on both Masterton Rd and Browns Bay Rd. It is often a good idea to wait until around 3.15pm to pick up your child from the pick-up zone.

SCHOOL DONATIONS

I would like to acknowledge the payment of donations recently. They have a direct impact on the quality of education we can offer your children. Although our school is funded through an Operation Grant which covers fixed running costs, we are very reliant on donations to maintain the standard we expect with extra Teacher hours, Teacher Aides, professional development for staff, computer equipment and new classroom resources. Please note that there are various ways to pay this donation and it can be claimed as a tax rebate at the end of the financial year.

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MOBILE PHONES

We would prefer that students did not bring mobile phones to school. If they are brought to school they must remain in their schoolbags and only be used after school for the purpose of contacting parents. Students are not permitted to use their mobile phone during class and break times. If your child is one who brings a mobile phone to school, I would appreciate that you reinforce this with them.

BOARD OF TRUSTEES ELECTIONS

This year we will be having the triennial Board of Trustee elections. The date for the election is 7th June. A Returning Officer has been appointed and will manage the election process. If you are interested in standing for the Board of Trustees you are welcome to be an observer at one of the monthly Board Meetings to get an understanding of the role. MUST READ: Confessions of a Browns Bay School jay walker

I remember when my kids started at Browns Bay School. We didn't bother to use the crossings. We had after-school activities to get to and it seemed like a major, inconvenient time-waster to go to the crossings. We always crossed through the traffic to get to our car on the far side of Browns Bay Road.

One day, I misjudged the gap between oncoming cars on Browns Bay Road. There I was trying to drag my small children, clumsy with their enormous backpacks, through oncoming traffic. While holding their hands I was screaming at them to "run" hoping no one was going to trip up as a car came hurtling towards us, throwing on its brakes. The kids were freaked, I was freaked and so was the driver, who had managed to slow down in time for us, thank goodness. It's fair to say it was a pretty low parenting moment when I realised the danger I had put everyone in.

It dawned on me the kids would need to learn how to start crossing roads by themselves soon enough and here I was teaching them (and other people's kids who were observing us) exactly how not to cross a road! I realised there was no way young kids would be able to make good judgments about when and where to cross an extremely busy road heck, as an adult I was doing it badly! I decided I needed to be a better role model, not just for my kids but for the safety of everyone in our neighbourhood.

So, we started using the school crossings. Simple! The kids groaned a little to begin with and then quickly accepted it was just part of the school day. It became a regular habit and soon no one even mentioned walking any other way. And do you know what? We got to our after-school activities at exactly the same time as before!

Use the school crossings. Always! No excuses! Keep all of our kids and community members safe. Show your kids the safest way to get to and from school.
