SCHOOL NOTICES

YEAR 1 – 3 CROSS COUNTRY

The Year 1 to 3 Cross Country race is planned to occur Wednesday June 5 at 1.30pm. The children will need to wear appropriate clothes on the day i.e. shorts not longs, and suitable footwear. Cross-country training has been part of our fitness program this term and we have encouraged all children to take part. The course is run inside the school grounds like previous years. There are teachers/ Y6 supervisors stationed all along the route. If your child is unwell or unable to take part in this event, please inform your child's teacher.

The students will assemble at 1.30pm and races will start at 1.40pm. The children will compete in Year levels as outlined below:
