TERM 4

Term 4 finishes on Thursday 19 December at 1.00pm and between now and then we have a busy educational programme for your children.

The Term 4 curriculum focus is: **Community / Hapori** and the Key Understanding is **'A group of people coming together and sharing common resources, social responsibilities, interests and values.'** The various Year teams will be looking at this topic in different ways – these will be shared with you through Team newsletters. Other major events happening across the school this term are Athletics, the Onepoto Festival, Waterwise and Jingle. We also have the Life Education Caravan and Harold at school at the moment. We are very grateful also to the parents who are giving up their time to become Waterwise Instructors with theory and practical sessions – good luck for the exam on Saturday!

Term 4 is a very important term for a school as it is a time where we review student's progress and achievement in preparation for reporting to parents. It is important that children attend school regularly so teachers have the time to get a valid and accurate assessment of where your child is at.

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NEW ZEALAND SHAKE OUT

New Zealand Shake Out, our national earthquake drill took place today at 1:30pm and the whole school took part. At that time we asked everyone to Drop, Cover and Hold. We did not take part in the tsunami hikoi as the school is above the inundation zone for a tsunami.

The children were asked to: Do the Drop, Cover, and Hold

- DROP down on your hands and knees. This protects you from falling but lets you move if you need to.
- COVER your head and neck (or your entire body if possible) under a sturdy table or desk (if it is within a few steps of you).
- HOLD on to your shelter (or your position to protect your head and neck) until the shaking stops. If the shaking shifts your shelter around, move with it.

BULLY STATEMENT

Is it Bullying?

- + When someone says or does something unintentionally hurtful and they do it once, that's rude.
- + When someone says or does something intentionally hurtful and they do it once, that's mean.
- + When someone says or does something intentionally hurtful and they keep doing it even when you tell them to stop or show them that you're upset that's bullying.

In last year's student Wellbeing survey we identified that students were not clear on what was or was not bullying.

Teachers are promoting a new poster definition with their classes titled "Is it Bullying?"

We will continue to support students and reinforce strategies to deal with Bullying e.g. Kia Kaha programme and using your WITS (as one option).


