TERM 1 AND 2

We finish school today for the Easter Holidays and Term 2 begins on Wednesday 26 April. After a difficult start to the year due to the Cyclone and Heavy Rain weather we were able to have a more settled Term than previous years. We have had school camps and outdoor education days; the swimming pool was in daily use; sports teams were competing, and the classrooms were buzzing with children learning.

Our School Inquiry topic in Term 2 is **Connections: Make Connections – seek to understand**. This has a Social Sciences focus on understanding how the past is important, and how time and change affect people's lives; with Technology forming a minor focus.

2022 ACHIEVEMENT

In 2022 the teaching focus was on Recovery Learning - due to interruptions to learning as a result of the Pandemic lockdowns and student / teacher illness. The data is from the Overall Teacher Judgement given by teachers for the students

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End of Year Report (Working Towards, At, Above) and / or the actual levels or stages of students in Reading, Writing and Mathematics. In the three curriculum areas (Reading, Writing and Mathematics), teachers have benchmarks to support their Overall Teacher Judgement.

The 2022 results were 12% to 24% higher than 2021 which was a great improvement and show a return to pre-Covid levels of achievement.

Another aspect we monitor is the progress students made throughout the year in Writing and Mathematics. We were very pleased with the results:

<u>Writing</u> 66% demonstrating accelerated progress.

<u>Mathematics</u> 40% demonstrating accelerated progress.

(Accelerated progress is when students make more than the expected progress of learning in a year.

POSITIVE BEHAVIOUR FOR LEARNING (PB4L)

Me whakahīhī ka tika, You should all feel really proud.

Positive Behaviour for Learning (PB4L) successfully launched at school this Term. We started with a focus on being sun smart and sun safe. It was wonderful to see a significant increase in the number of school hats being worn consistently during break times. Thank you for supporting your children to have their hats at school.

We then explored when and how we use manners. The teachers on duty have been so impressed with the friendly greetings and farewells from most students each day. It certainly brings a smile to all of our faces.

In Term 2 we will move onto different topics starting with wearing the correct uniform with pride. So that your children can feel successful and proud at school, we want to remind you of the expectations for uniforms.

School staff will be looking for opportunities to praise students for wearing their correct uniform. Please help them by ensuring that they have the items they need.

Observed on 25 April each year, Anzac Day was originally devised to honour the members of the Australian and New Zealand soldiers who served in the Gallipoli campaign, their first engagement in World War One.
