KEEPING OURSELVES SAFE PROGRAMME

In the last three weeks of this Term your child will be taking part in the 'Keeping Ourselves Safe' personal safety programme. This programme has been designed to provide children with the skills to cope in situations that might involve abuse. It has three overall aims:

- To recognise unsafe behaviours
- To develop and strengthen skills children need to keep themselves safe
- To support and encourage children to get help from caring adults

Keeping Ourselves Safe has been developed by the New Zealand Police. It will be taught by your child's teacher, with help from a Police Education Officer as required.

To be successful, **Keeping Ourselves Safe** needs your help and support. Some homework activities will come home for you to work on with your child. It is important that you participate as much as possible, so that you can reinforce the messages children are getting and help your child use their new skills with confidence.

POSITIVE BEHAVIOUR FOR LEARNING (PB4L)

Positive Behaviour for Learning (PB4L) - Our focus in our PB4L Lessons continues to be on wearing the correct school uniform with pride. This week we have seen a greater number of students wearing the correct additional layers, socks and tights. It's great to see. Our goal is for the whole school to be dressed in the correct uniform. Thank you for supporting your children to help us achieve this.

Next week our focus turns to jewellery, watches, and personal digital devices.

Jewellery Policy:

- Jewellery that has a special cultural or religious significance for the family can be worn at school.
- The wearing of jewellery such as dangling earrings, rings, bracelets and necklaces can be very dangerous, particularly during play activities **and these should not be worn to school**.
- Plain studs are preferred due to safety.
- On rare occasions students have to wear bracelets for medical reasons: on such occasions the parent/caregiver is asked to contact the Deputy Principal.

Watches, phones and smart devices:

A personal digital device is any privately owned digital device that is not part of our school Bring your own Device (BYOD) programme. This includes cell phones, smart watches, tablets, and other similar devices.

We do not recommend that students bring these personal digital devices to school. They are not necessary to have during the day. However, we understand that some parents like their children to have a device to communicate with them after school.

If a student does bring a personal digital device to school, the following guidelines apply:

- The school does not accept responsibility for lost, damaged, or stolen personal digital devices.
- The device should be kept turned off and out of sight.
- Devices must not be used at break times.
- Personal digital devices may not be taken on EOTC events.

If a parent needs to contact their child urgently during the day, please call the school office 09 479 4301.

Please note that <u>Smart watches need to have their smart features disabled during school time.</u>
