REPORTING TO PARENTS

In Week 2 of next term, we will be holding our Mid-Year Conferences. The Conferences will be on 26 and 27 July beginning at 2pm and ending at 6.30pm. The purpose of these conferences is to have 'learning conversations' between students, parents and teachers. Students have a key role to play in these conferences so it would be appreciated if they could attend if at all possible.

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The written report is used to support the conference discussion. It is based on assessment information, collected by the teachers through observations, interviews and general class work. In the senior classes information has also been gathered from standardised tests. The report will show parents the level where their children are in English and Mathematics, as well as the Browns Bay School Values.

This year the Year 1 and 2 reports will display where the children are at in Structured Literacy. This is the first time we will report on Structured Literacy and information on the programme can be found <u>here</u> on our school website.

PB4L

At our last School Assembly, the Peer Mediators enacted a role play to the children on using "I statement's". We have reinforced this message in our PB4L lessons this week – the messages were:

Who is using the "I" statement and who is using the "You" statement.

Role Play 1

Sina: "You are always playing with Jane lately, Tom. I saw you whispering together at break. You were telling her all the secrets I told you last week. You're a blabber-mouth! I'll never tell you anything again.

Tom: "You're a liar! I wasn't even talking about you or your secrets! You're just jealous because Jane is my friend."

Role Play 2

Lee: "I feel hurt that you are spending so much time with Maria. I feel left out. When I see you whispering together I feel worried because I'm afraid you might share the secrets I trusted you to keep."

Rob: "I didn't mean to hurt your feelings, Lee, I was just pleased to see Maria again. I haven't been telling your secrets and I do still want you for my friend."

Which role play has the better ending, and why?

Why "You" statement aren't doing any good when you are trying to share your point of view:

KEEPING OURSELVES SAFE PROGRAMME

This week we begin the 'Keeping Ourselves Safe' personal safety programme. This programme has been designed to provide children with the skills to cope in situations that might involve abuse. It has three overall aims:

- To recognise unsafe behaviours
- To develop and strengthen skills children need to keep themselves safe
- To support and encourage children to get help from caring adults

Keeping Ourselves Safe has been developed by the New Zealand Police. It will be taught by your child's teacher, with help from a Police Education Officer as required.

To be successful, **Keeping Ourselves Safe** needs your help and support. Some homework activities will come home for you to work on with your child.

It is important that you participate as much as possible, so that you can reinforce the messages children are getting and help your child use their new skills with confidence.




LEARNING HOW TO WEAVE

A huge thank you to all the parents who helped on the day. We couldn't do it without you!












MATHEX COMPETITION

Three Browns Bay School teams competed in the Year 6 Mathex Competition at Northcross Intermediate School against about 60 other teams. It was an intense competition with 30 minutes to solve 20 questions. Browns Bay Team 2 scored the maximum of 100 points with seconds to go in the final minute and placed 5th. The Browns Bay School Team 3 were in hot pursuit with only 2 questions left at the end. This was the first time Browns Bay School had two teams that had scored 100 points..... Because team 1 also had 100 points. Team 3 were only questions away and had 85 points. So, all 3 teams had a combined score of 285 points. Browns Bay Team 1 came 3rd with 9 minutes and 41 seconds to spare, even though they were 7th to finish on time but 3rd on points in that time. They came 3rd and were awarded bronze medals. It was such an intense, fast, and fun competition, even though Rafe from Team 1 complained every ten seconds that they were 'too slow'!
















BBS Y4-6 CROSS COUNTRY RUN

We are very proud of all the students who participated and look forward to seeing another great turn out next year.





With colder weather on the rise, the FOTS team is organising a Family Board Games event to create some fun memories.


