The written report is used to support the conference discussion. It is based on assessment information, collected by the teachers through observations, interviews and general class work. In the senior classes information has also been

gathered from standardised tests. The report will show parents the level where their children are in English and Mathematics, as well as the Browns Bay School Values.

The purpose of these conferences is to have 'learning conversations' between students, parents and teachers. Students have a key role to play in these conferences so it would be appreciated if they could attend if at all possible. If you require longer, I suggest that you arrange a separate time with your child's teacher at a later date, so as not to inconvenience other parents.

POSITIVE BEHAVIOUR FOR LEARNING (PB4L)

This term we will continue our weekly PB4L lessons. Our focus is on developing positive social skills and respectful friendships. This week students are learning when it's important to tell an adult about something that's happened and when it's just tattling. We want them to understand that sometimes saying something or telling on someone is not the right thing or the kind thing to do (e.g., when the problem does not require an adult to help solve it).

Next week our focus will be about respecting other people's point of view, even if it's different to their own. It's ok for people to have differences of opinion yet how we respond to them can make a big impact on how we make them feel. Please ask your child/children what they have learned.

He oranga ngākau, he pikinga waiora

Positive feelings in your heart will enhance your sense of self-worth.

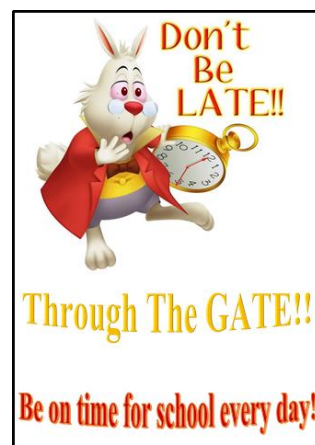

SCHOOL START TIME

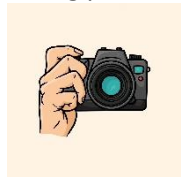
I would like to remind some of our parents that we expect the children to be in class at 8.50am to get ready for the school day. I have noticed some students are arriving late to class. The children are missing out on learning, and it can be disruptive to the class as they prepare for the day.

We would ask that you prepare for your children to be in class on time (or just before).



SHARING IMAGES OF STUDENTS

I am bringing the following guidelines to everyone's attention because on Monday afternoon a parent was observed taking photos on the school grounds after 3pm with students still around.



Browns Bay School follows guidelines to protect students' privacy and safety at school when we publish student information. This includes sharing photos of our students. We encourage our school community to also consider privacy issues when sharing photos and videos taken at school events.

We are happy for parents to take photos/videos of their children at sports day, cultural day, or other public school events. If copyright issues apply, such as at a school play, which forbid photos or videos to be taken, the school makes this known.

If parents want to share photos/videos on social media, they should consider the following:

- Show the images to your children and discuss them before posting them on social media. This will help your children understand that they should always think about what goes out to the public on the internet.
- If the images have pictures of other students, think about editing to remove them.
- Make sure that other students are not named in any online posts.
- Parents should remember that posting photos of other people can amount to harassment and they should take care to ensure photos are fair to other people.
- Students are also expected to consider privacy and cybersafety issues when sharing photos and using social media.

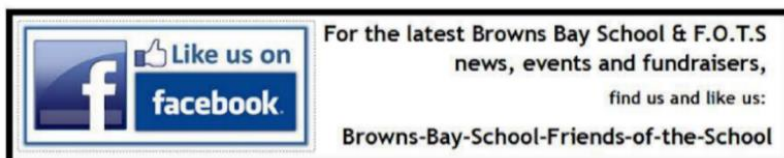
