As the time draws nearer to Principal Peter Mulcahy's retirement, I wanted to provide you with a comprehensive update on the progress we have made in this transition period.

Over the past two months, the Board of Trustees has been collaborating with The Education Group. Recognized nationwide for their proficiency, the consulting team has been assisting us in several key areas, including defining the hiring process, establishing selection criteria, crafting advertisements, refining candidate filtering mechanisms, and setting forth interview procedures. Their guidance and expertise have been invaluable to us as we move forward.

A sincere mihi to everyone who participated in our three surveys sent out to teachers and staff, students, and the wider community. The response rate exceeded our expectations, indicating the genuine concern and interest our community has in this transition. The heartfelt comments and thoughtful suggestions we received have played a crucial role in shaping our selection and advertising strategies. We've thoroughly documented, summarized, and incorporated these responses to ensure that the voice of our community reverberates in our decisions.

We're happy to announce that the draft of the Principal Application Pack and our advertisements are near completion. By mid-September, they will be made available online and will also be featured in nationwide publications.

October will be dedicated to reviewing applications, conducting reference checks, and finalizing our shortlist. By November, we plan to complete the interview

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rounds and conclude our hiring process. This timeline ensures that we have the entirety of Term 1, 2024, to facilitate a structured, well-orchestrated transition, allowing the incoming principal ample time to integrate and align with our school's ethos and values. We are grateful for the continued support and engagement from our community. Together, we look forward to welcoming a new chapter in our school's history while upholding the standards and traditions set by Principal Mulcahy.

OUT OF ZONE ENROLMENT 2024 APPLICATIONS

It has been great to receive the new student enrolments for 2024 from our local families. If you do know of any families with school age children in 2024 – please encourage them to enrol in their local school. It is really important for schools to have those numbers now so they can plan for 2024 classes.

The student enrolments have allowed the Board to invite out of zone enrolment applications from parents who wish to enrol their children for next year. Enrolment at the school is governed by an enrolment scheme, details of which are available from the school office or on the school website. Applications can be made through the Browns Bay School website.

The Board has determined that the following out of zone places are available for 2024.

Year 0 - 2: 25 places in total

Year 4 - 5 places

The deadline for receipt of applications for out of zone places is Wednesday 11 October. If necessary, the Ballot will take place on Wednesday 18 October.
