MAORI LANGUAGE WEEK

This week marks Māori Language Week. Māori language is a part of the culture and identity of New Zealanders and is one of the three official languages of New Zealand. This observance helps to preserve and advocate the usage of a crucial part of the nation's history.

To support the theme for Te Wiki o Te Reo Māori, I would encourage parents to learn the following vowel sounds for Te Reo:

Our Te Reo programme is run in all classes by teachers and is supported by Meika Isgrove and Stephanie Rogers, our Specialist Teachers. Meika and Stephanie teach Te Reo with all classes during Classroom Release Time.

PĪPĪWHARAUROA FESTIVAL

A group of 12, Year 4 students led by Kylie Engleback have been working on a special collective art piece for the Pipiwharauroa Festival being hosted by Rangitoto College on Monday 18 September. This festival is the culmination of an innovative programme within the Mid Bays Kāhui Ako (COL) to authentically weave Mātauranga Māori across our curriculum in Term 3.

Part of our Kaupapa for this Festival of Mātauranga is to share the knowledge and resources with the wider community, and ultimately develop opportunities for educators and students to embed Mātauranga into their curriculum. Using the uniting thread of the Pipiwharauroa (bronze shining cuckoo), this event provides an authentic platform for learners from Year 0 - Year 10+ to engage in Mātauranga Māori in a festival that weaves kapa haka, te reo, art, commerce, community, whanaungatanga and maramataka, all in time for Te Wiki o Te Reo Māori, Māori Language Week, and Māhuru Māori - Māori Language September.

Within this art piece, each student is represented by two leaves on their branch of the Kumera vine. One of the leaves shows their place in New Zealand where they live currently. The other leaf is where their family comes from or identifies with for their own cultural heritage. Students looked at New Zealand artist Claudia Pond Eyley for inspiration for the style used to draw and paint their landscapes. Then they created their piece using PVA and black paint and flat plains of colour. All the leaves and vines link together into a shared kete bringing everyone's work together as a collective piece.
