- Please ensure your child has eaten before 5.45pm and has used the bathroom.
- During Jingle the Year 3 to 6 children sit with their class and teacher throughout all performances until the finish.

The Year 0, 1 and 2 children will be sitting with their teachers at the front, facing the performance before and after their item...parents to collect from their sitting place at the end of the show.

EINSTEIN OLYMPIAD

A group of Year 5 and 6 students participated in the annual MidBays Kahui Ako Einstein Olympiad. The students were part of teams with Murrays Bay Intermediate and Rangitoto College students as they competed in a variety of activities. The activities involved academic activities in literacy, numeracy and technology. The students had a great day meeting other like-minded students. It was a successful, fun day and we were pleased to see Browns Bay students in the groups that were placed second and third.





SCHOOLS SUSTAINABILITY CHALLENGE SERIES

A team of 4 Year 6 students competed at the Lactic Turkey Schools Sustainability Challenge Series at Long Bay Regional Reserve.

Each race is for teams of 4 students to compete in a 2-hour event, which includes a mix of running/walking, navigation, and sustainability-based activities. Teams navigate to as many checkpoints as they can, collecting points for each checkpoint visited. To earn extra points teams can complete sustainability themed activities which will require some research and teamwork. Examples of activities could be to identify native bird calls, match a pest to the correct trap used or make something from flax.

The aim of the event was to:

- provide an opportunity for students to show their physical capabilities through recreational activities in the outdoors.
- Provide a challenge in offering a range of activities that help students understand how parks and our environment are managed, especially regarding pest management (Ark in the Park, PTA control etc), and the impacts of recreation.
- Help foster a sense of stewardship by exposing them to Auckland Regional Parks environments, how special they are, the threats posed to them, and an understanding of how students can help minimise these.

Our Team on the day said it was a very cool and challenging experience.

We are also very proud of them for their amazing results. Out of 90 schools ranging from Senior Primary to High School, Browns Bay School came an outstanding **4th place overall** and then took out **1st place** in the Primary School division! An amazing achievement!

Lastly, a huge thank you to Harry's parents for organising and supporting the team!





TE AO MAORI DAY

This year our Māori ākonga (identified on our school roll) were involved in a Te Ao Māori day at school. This day was a collaboration between the School and the Māori Whanau Community to support Māori students in their cultural knowledge. The day was reflective of the following Māori values: Kotahitanga -unity and togetherness; Manaakitanga - hospitality, kindness and support; Whanaungatanga - making connections, building relationships through shared experiences and working together to provide a sense of belonging. The students had a thoroughly enjoyable day, preparing and sharing together, playing traditional Māori games, and learning to weave and understand some tikanga around harakeke/raranga. It was also very moving to see the tuakana-teina relationships (where the older students helped and guided the younger students) flourish and develop.
