

PRINCIPALS MESSAGE

Dear Parents and Caregivers, Kia Ora

I am looking forward to the Lunar Festival Cultural Event taking place tomorrow Friday 23 February in the school hall from 3.30pm to 5.30pm. I am very grateful to Sylvia Wei and her team for organising the event (see flyer in the School Events and FOTS section of this newsletter for more information).

STUDENT SAFETY

I need to re-inforce my message from last week with regards to our student's safety. The roads around the school have been very busy in the mornings and afternoons and we are still witnessing some concerning 'traffic behaviour'. I



would ask that everyone be mindful of the message they are sending to the children, particularly in regard to crossing the road. We have two Pedestrian Crossings in operation in the morning and afternoon and we ask that you please use them with your children. Crossing on the corner of Browns Bay Road and Masterton Road in between the traffic is **not** a safe message to pass onto the children.

The drop off/pick up zone is not a place that cars can wait at — please move on if your child is not ready for you — the queues of cars waiting to get into the pick-up area cause a huge amount of traffic congestion on both Masterton Road and Browns Bay Road.

Another student safety reminder is in regard to early drop off and late pickups. We do not have staff on duty until 8.30am in the morning and we cannot care for

children before that time. In the afternoon teachers go off duty at 3.10pm and are not responsible for looking after children. Please be mindful of these times and that you, the parent, are responsible for children before and after school. After 3pm, children should **not** be left unsupervised on the school playground.

SCHOOL DONATIONS

I would like to acknowledge the payment of donations recently. They have a direct impact on the quality of education we can provide for your children. Although our school is funded through an Operation Grant which covers fixed running costs, we are very reliant on donations to maintain the standard we expect with extra teacher hours, teacher aides, professional development for staff, computer equipment and new classroom resources.

Please note that there are various ways to pay this donation and it can be claimed as a tax rebate at the end of the financial year.

We've noticed a significant increase in students wearing correct school uniform and hats when outside. Thank you for helping your children to have the uniform items they need. This week our AWHI lesson focussed on the ways we show respect to everyone in our school community. We have wonderful senior students who organise Friendship Games for the juniors at lunchtimes and others who are Peer Mediators. They support students during lunch times and help them to solve problems they may have. They do an incredible job so we want all of our students to know who they are and to treat them with the respect they deserve.

Next week we will continue to develop our school value of Respect by learning how we show respect when we are moving through the school and at school assemblies. This is an excellent time to ask your child/children what they have learned and to discuss how we change our behaviour for different settings e.g. why we don't talk through movies or how we share equipment at the playground.

ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING and "SIPS & NIBBLES" Monday 11 March 6:30pm


