STRATEGIC GOALS FOR 2024

1. Our Vision



The Strategic Plan focuses on achieving our Vision of **Building Leaders and Learners.**

Browns Bay School's Strategic Plan is a key planning document that sets out the school's objectives and targets for the year.

The document contains our Strategic Plan for 2024 and 2025 so that we can then be effective in setting teaching and learning programmes and guiding the activities of our school. The Annual Plan is included and this plan expands on the goals for 2024. The Statement of Variances outline our educational goals for the year. The Strategic Goals are in these three areas:

CURRICULUM: To develop policy and plans to meet the requirements of the Refreshed Curriculum, including an investigation into a balanced curriculum delivery to ensure there is a focus on all curriculum with emphasis on Literacy and Numeracy.

COMMUNITY: To develop a strong engaged school community with stakeholders aware of the changes in education and students learning key values and having success at school.

TE TIRITI O WAITANGI: To have a strong understanding of Te Tiriti o Waitangi with Māori ako learning as Māori.

POWHIRI

A School Powhiri will be held in the School Hall to welcome Teresa Burn on Thursday 11 April at 11am. The Powhiri is a Māori ceremony to welcome the Manuhiri (Visitors) into a new space, easing them in to feeling comfortable to the point where they feel at one with the Tangata Whenua (the Hosts).

The Powhiri follows a set series of protocol (kawa) that consists of the **Karanga – Whaikorero – Hongi – Kai**. Karanga – a call from a woman of the Tangata Whenua to start proceedings.

Whaikorero – formal speeches made from both the Tangata Whenua (the hosts) and Manuhiri (visitors) Hongi – greetings.

Kai – food and drink shared.

Browns Bay School is being supported by Mr John Retimana and Kapa Haka groups from our school and Rangitoto College.

AWHI UPDATE



We've noticed that students are choosing to be kind and supportive of each other more since our AWHI lesson on kind versus unkind behaviours last Monday. Hopefully you are noticing them making some great choices at home too.

Next week's lesson explores ways that we can create a bully free school. The first step is to understand what bullying actually is. This poster can help you talk with your children about the difference. Your children are also learning about when and how to get help if someone is rude, mean or is bullying them. It would be great to remind them at home that they should tell the duty teacher, their own teacher, a peer mediator or cultural leader if something has gone wrong. The sooner we know, the sooner we can sort out any issues.
