

The road to the Hall has been outlined and the second part of the basement is being prepared for the final concrete pour.


The size of the building is becoming very obvious. It will have space for 6 classrooms on each floor.

#### **YEAR 1 SCIENCE**

Year 1 students are working on science this term. Here are 2 experiments from Room 11.

The first experiment was their germ observation. They were wanting to know if washing their hands with soap and water or sanitising them kills all the germs. The result was yes, washing is good but sanitising is better.





In the second experiment they wanted to see what would happen if they put white flowers in water with dye. The prediction was that the flowers might change colour in an hour but would definitely change colour in a day. They found out they can change colour in about an hour but after a day they had more colour and after 1 week they were amazing.
