Tomorrow morning at 5.30am we will begin assembling to bless the new building.

Next week we will be moving furniture and equipment in, with classes beginning on Monday 22 August. It has been a long time coming and it is wonderful to soon have the building in use. The original discussion about the need for new rooms due to roll growth goes back to 2014 and successive Boards of Trustees have continued to advocate for more classrooms. The twelve classrooms replace the four original rooms on site and allow for the additional roll growth.

The teachers in the Year 5 and 6 Teams have been preparing for this move for 3 years with the facilitator Jo Robson providing great support. The teachers and students are keen to get into their new building!

I have been very impressed with the Teams from the Ministry of Education, GHD Architects and Woodview who have completed the new block under the pressures of a pandemic and a shortage of building supplies. They have collaborated co-operatively with the school to ensure it is as planned and we are delighted with the result.


They will meet Harry again for the next two Tuesdays to look at designing and creating their own traditional kites.

YEAR 5 WITH HARRY AND BAREFOOTED NZ

In Year 5 this term, students will be working with Harry from Barefooted NZ every second Friday to complete handson activities that reinforce what students are learning in the classroom during Topic time. At the end of week two, students met with Harry to learn about water purification systems used throughout New Zealand to clean our drinking water. In teams, students gathered natural materials around the school and placed these into a funnel. They then poured the water into the funnel to see how these materials helped to purify the water. Finally, the students reflected on how they would improve their filter to purify the water. A wonderful hands-on learning experience!

CAR SAFETY

On Wednesday morning we had a visit from Constable Simon Fox (Browns Bay Community Constable) at the Drop Off Zone. Simon was doing a spot check on children in boosters and seat belts. Simon advised parents on the requirement for the children to **keep the seat belt on until the car has stopped.** A significant number of children had unclicked while the car was still moving.



Requirements for child restraints

Age of child	The law says you must:
Until their 7th birthday	Correctly secure your child in an approved child restraint
From their 7th to their 8th birthday	Correctly secure your child in an approved child restraint if one is available in the vehicle (and if not, in any child restraint or safety belt that is available)
From their 8th birthday to 14 years old	Must use safety belts if available. If not available, they must travel in the back seat
Over 14 years old	Must use safety belts where they are available

International best practice recommends the use of an appropriate child restraint (or booster seat) until your child reaches 148 cm tall or is 11 years old. Child restraint and medical professionals recommend that you keep your baby in a rear-facing restraint until as old as practicable, at least until they are 2 years of age.






